PLACES OF INTEREST

A - Fenor Bog

This biodiversity rich, rare naturally regenerating fen habitat, is a refuge for species that are found nowhere else in the county. Loop walk 1.2km (15min)

B - Ann Valley Walk

The trail meanders through beautiful constructed wetland ponds, woodland and marshland along the Anne river connecting Dunhill and Annestown. Keep an eye out for protected wildlife such as otters and herons on your way. A simply wonderful example of an amenity developed by local landowners and the community. Linear walk 5km(1hr) fgrade A fully accessible for all abilities.

C - Dunhill Castle

Wonderfully atmospheric with commanding views and a checkered history, located halfway on Ann Valley Walk. From the castle you can also follow a side path to the remains of a medieval church and graveyard.

D - Fire and Ice

The stretch of road between Annestown and Bunmahon offers outstanding views of the coast in all directions. Multiple off road view points are located here. Look out for the Fire and Ice sculpture representing the geological formation of the Copper Coast rocks.

E - Tankardstown

Industrial heritage buildings from 19th century copper mining works. The landscaped surroundings with their coastal vistas are a feature in themselves, one of the key sites of the UNESCO Global Geopark

F - Geological Garden and Boardwalk

The path in the geological garden will guide you through time depicting the Earth's formation and evolution of life. Here also feature two ogham stones aligned to the solstice and the curious 'cursing stone'. The boardwalk takes you on a loop over Bunmahon beach and is wheelchair accessible from the west end.

G - UNESCO Global Geopark Visitor Centre

Located in a renovated former church of Ireland building. Here you can learn about geology, see fossils and minerals, learn about the mining history and local connections. Visitor information, Cafe and gift Shop. Free entry. Opening hours vary seasonally please check website www.coppercoastgeopark.com

H - Tra na mBo Cliff Walk

Beguín at the surf school, a short steep road than a track along the cliff tops with imposing views over the bay takes you along the headland to reach Tra na mBo. A path leads down to the sea stack on the beach. Linear walk 3km(35min) moderate, best visited at low tide

I - Ballydowane

One of Ireland's top rated beaches, best visited at low tide. An important geosite, in the cliffs here you can observe Devonian sandstone (purple hues) created when the copper coast was underwater in a tropical sea, coming together with older Ordovician andesite rocks (greenish colour) that are volcanic, a time gap of 80million years.

J - Stradbally Village to Durrow

The prettiness of the village strikes all visitors. The ruins beside St James church are medieval, the older parts built in the 1200s. At the foot of the hill is the bridge over the river Tay and a gate leading into the unique cove. A 11km cycle loop links the village to the greenway access where you can visit Durrow tunnel and Ballyvoyle viaduct

K - Gaulstown dolmen

One of the finest examples in Ireland of a prehistoric portal tomb known as a Dolmen, 3500-4000 BC. Accessible through private land, please be mindful of not blocking access when visiting, not suitable for large groups



3 Monavaud Lodge

Located in a peaceful village location, the house has been lovingly restored and is available for self catering, member of Failte Ireland and ISCF, pet friendly.

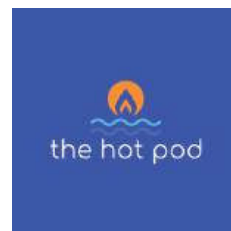

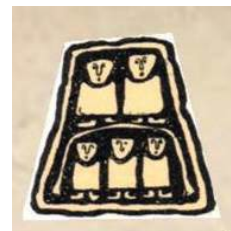

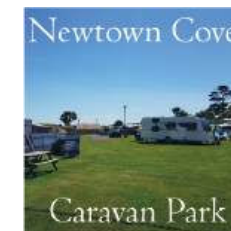
